**Marie Skłodowska-Curie Post-doc Positions:
“Expression of Interest” for hosting Fellows at the
Meertens Institute in the Netherlands**

The Meertens Institute invites postdoc fellows to apply together for postdoc funding in the context of the Marie Skłodowska Curie Individual fellowship scheme for EF (European Fellows).

The Meertens Institute (<http://www.meertens.knaw.nl/cms/nl/?lang=en>), established in 1926, has been a research institute of the Royal Netherlands Academy of Arts and Sciences (abbreviated: **KNAW**, <https://www.knaw.nl/en>) since 1952. We study the diversity in language and culture in the Netherlands. The KNAW is responsible for fifteen research institutes. The institutes are active in the humanities, the social sciences and the life sciences; one institute works at the interface of science and government policy. The Academy institutes are meant to play a leading role in Dutch and international research. They serve as national centers of expertise, manage unique infrastructures, and provide access to their collections, many of which are world-famous.

The Meertens Institute will offer support during the application procedure to candidates who would like to spend their Marie S. Curie fellowship at the Meertens Institute. In case of funding through the EU, the postdoc fellow will become employed at the Meertens Institute for the duration of the project; receiving training and potential opportunities for further continuation of their international scientific career.

The MSCA *mobility rule* applies: the researcher must not have lived, worked, or studied in the Netherlands more than 12 months during the 3 years prior to the deadline. The duration of the fellowship is 12 to 24 months and primarily covers the salary of the researcher plus a family allowance for spouses and/or children. Applicants either hold a PhD degree or have at least four years of full-time equivalent research experience at the moment of the deadline.

The Marie S. Curie **deadline is 12 September 2018 at 17h.**

Interested candidates should send their CV, including the name of their preferred supervisor at the Meertens Institute, a list of publications, and a short motivation letter no later than June 1, 2018 to sollicitaties@bb.huc.knaw.nl.
