## Het "onregelmatige" vocalisme bij een aantal sterke werkwoorden in Brabantse dialecten

## Abstract

In most Belgian Brabantine dialects the vocalism of the infinitive and the present of strong verbs belonging to classes 3b, 4 and 5 is more closed than the normal representative of wG  $\ddot{e}$  in closed (class 3b) or open syllabe (classes 4 and 5). Obviously it goes back to an *i*, which originated from the common Germanic "breaking" in the present singular and was generalized by analogy in these dialects. In class 6 the umlaut vocalism of the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>th</sup> person singular was generalized in a similar way only in the verb *varen*, but this happened in all Belgian Brabantine dialects. In class 7 we find rests of the analogic extension of umlaut vocalism in two verbs: *blazen* and *braden*. They occur in the southwestern Brabantine periphery.
